Experience

Over the last fifteen years, Paul Lukez has been engaged in teaching, research and practice in parallel, exploring a professional model which allows the lessons learned from each set of endeavors to enrich the other. The results of this professional track have resulted in the release of *Suburban Transformations* (Princeton Architectural Press, October 2007), which proposes strategies and processes for transforming suburbs and edge cities into more sustainable and habitable environments, with a unique identity strongly linked to the landscape. Computer simulations developed while teaching at MIT illustrate how banal environments can evolve over time through the strategic and tactical interventions of stakeholders and residents. The ideas embedded in the book are the result of extensive academic and professionally based research, both in the US and overseas (Holland and China).

Paul Lukez's active practice is engaged in the design and construction of a variety of building types, including residential, housing, interiors, commercial, and infrastructure - planning projects. In all project types, special attention is directed towards the craft of building and the design processes that support its enrichment. The studio's current projects include the design of a state of the art 50,000 SF sustainable building for recreational uses in Hangzhou, China. In addition, his practice recently completed the urban design of a \$500 million TOD in Revere Beach, MA.

Paul Lukez is a graduate of MIT, and has worked for nationally and internationally recognized architectural firms such as S.O.M. / Chicago, William Rawn Associates, Arrowstreet Inc. and Wallace Floyd. He is the recipient of academic and professional honors, and his work has been recognized by editors of local, regional and (inter)national publications. Paul Lukez taught most recently as a professor at MIT.
